



News From the Residents' Association

Boundaries

Thanks again to all those residents and institutions who made the effort to write with reasoned objection to the Boundary Commission's proposal to split Weston Green down the middle. It worked. The Commissioners altered their recommendations to favour the rational alternative we had proposed. Their draft recommendations had been based on the County Council's scheme which Surrey had earlier submitted over the head of strong objections from our county councillor. Peter Hickman. In the consultation phase we fleshed out those objections, mobilised community awareness of what was happening, researched and presented the sensible alternative. Many, in particular our Weston Green Borough Councillors and membership secretary, trudged around delivering informative leaflets, and we emailed all Association members who furnish their email addresses for substantive messages.

The result was 131 submissions opposing their scheme, citing strong community interests between Weston Green and Thames Ditton. Submissions referred to shared facilities such as the Library, local schools, churches, children and youth activity centres, the Centre for the retired and various sports clubs as well as to the common history of Weston Green and Thames Ditton and, not least, the active Residents' Association.

"We found the evidence relating to community identity and interests compelling and are persuaded that dividing the area of Weston Green would be detrimental to a community that has demonstrated strong links with Thames Ditton... Consequently, we have modified our boundaries in Elmbridge between East Molesey & Esher and The Dittons divisions, to include Weston Green in its entirety in The Dittons division."

Well done, everyone – and well done the Commission. The new arrangements must now be implemented by Parliament, to come into force at the county council elections in May 2013.

Street lights

spirited action Thanks to Elmbridge's Heritage officers to preserve the special character and appearance of the Conservation Areas (and to continuing background pressure from the Association) there is pleasing progress to report on street lights for those areas. Surrey have now agreed a proper heritage pattern of column and lamp, the "Iffley" (see picture), as a suitable replacement for all the existing swan-necked lights. The Day of the 'Triffids' is over. Moreover, more of this pattern will be provided for other suitable locations within all three of our Conservation Areas, although exactly how many has still to be finalised. So that's another "well done" to be uttered.

Movin' on

There was general concern on 1 February when travellers' caravans appeared overnight on Weston Green, spotted by our councillors who notified the authorities. They had been moved on from a site in Ham. Fortunately, swift, firm, determined yet highly diplomatic action by the Elmbridge Parks management team, notably Ian Gayton, working with the Neighbourhood Police team, defused the situation and persuaded them to move out of the area on the following day. Another plaudit!

Yellow lines

The situation is not so good here. The arrival of yellow lines was delayed because the subcontractors engaged were found not to be up to the job (reported

Surrey County Council). The new contractors set about the work to mingled cries of joy and anguish among residents, corresponding with strongly-held views on such lines. They did not do it well: they were specifically instructed that within the Conservation Areas there must be 'heritage quality' narrow, mustardcolour yellow lines. Instead they painted large ones, bright yellow, broad, blobby and not totally parallel, and right over existing white lines, some of which had been refreshed only days before, to make an unbecoming mess. Surrey have apologised to our Councillor Peter Hickman, whose views on the matter will not pass the censor, for this and other glitches in the process. As we go to press a meeting of officials and contractors was being held to decide what to do about it.

It has been impossible, so far, to evaluate the effects of the new lines on traffic choke-points because of the roadworks (mostly gas mains) that have since plagued Thames Ditton, at times choking everything.

Libraries

The High Court has issued an injunction against Surrey County Council over plans to close 10 libraries if 'volunteers' don't take them on. The fourth council to be taken to judicial review over library cutbacks, Surrey's hearing is scheduled for mid-March. Actor Stephen Fry has supported fundraising for Surrey campaigners against the county's plans on his Twitter feed. In Somerset and Gloucestershire, but not in Brent, campaigners have been successful in quashing council plans to close libraries.

Council Tax

More signs that the new county leadership under Cllr. Hodge is being more realistic – while he has the luxury of blaming his predecessors. The new corporate strategy document states: "In 2008 Surrey County Council was failing Surrey residents. Key essential services were not being delivered effectively. Some were close to failure. Our costs were spiralling out of control." You may

distinctly recall that at the time, Surrey's Public Relations team and Cabinet members were busy disseminating exactly the opposite message to the public. The Council's corporate communications have scant credibility.

Surrey will increase Council Tax by 2.99% in the coming year – a tiny fraction below the cap. They will thereby forego the Government's 2.5% subsidy to councils who go for the headline "freeze."

However, freezes always result in distortions and Surrey is in a bad way. Residents would be less unhappy about a CT increase if the County genuinely inspired more confidence that our money would be well and wisely spent on what taxpayers want.

Meanwhile in Elmbridge, Council Leader John O'Reilly promised residents attending the Open Meeting on Council Tax in January that the Borough would again freeze Council Tax next year. However, we see that the draft corporate plan for the borough does actually contain provision to raise CT next year (FY 2013/2014). 2013, of course, is a year when there are no Borough elections. The last time there were no Borough elections, four years ago, the Elmbridge leadership raised Council Tax by twice the rate of inflation.

Schools

One of the reasons for a CT increase advanced by the embattled caucus in Surrey, which has fallen short in planning ahead for adequate school places, is the need to build more schools. They are right. Pressures are again growing to make the temporary four-form entry at Thames Ditton Infant School a more permanent fait accompli. This time the admission pressures come from within a reasonable catchment area rather than from outside the area as previously. The issue is complex: debate has opened up in our web forum. Meanwhile the bulge is transferring upwards to the Junior School which is seeking extra buildings. There are also plans to provide more buildings at Esher College.

Local NHS peers into void

As last year, front-line NHS services in Surrey are suffering drastic cuts which affect our local surgeries. The NHS funds fewer patients than exist in reality (so Giggs Hill Surgery are paid for only 6,000 patients of their current 8,000) and on top of that the funding per patient has been slashed by almost forty percent. Government pledges are clearly irrelevant.

The county NHS administration has arbitrarily altered contractual obligations for specialised medical services – such as that provided by Giggs Hill's MEDICS. The issues are complex and opaque but the practical effect is to reduce the number of patients treated by around one quarter. With current uncertainties, patients are likely to find it more difficult to get the treatment needed. The process by which the system was intended to run more efficiently is jeopardised, leaving our local surgeries and clinics precariously exposed.

Planning

Since our last issue there have been three appeals from developers contesting refusal of planning permission by Elmbridge, against the background of new Government guidelines to Planning Inspectors and of Elmbridge's new Core Strategy document. It is reassuring to report that in all three, the local Elmbridge decisions were upheld by the Planning Inspector (the proposed taxi office at Winter's Bridge; six houses to replace 31 Embercourt Road, and a two-bed house at the entrance to Ashley Road car park)

There are two controversial applications now current. One is by

Colets, to concrete over the grass verge by the Infant School to provide a row of parking for staff cars. As we go to press, this has already drawn 43 objections including one from the Association.

The other concerns the former Crown Inn, acquired by a Thai restaurant chain. Now registered as **Ba Siam Ltd**, they have carried out alterations to install large air-conditioning units, illuminated signs, and an adjacent angular structure the size of a house which is described as a "lantern pergola." These things were done without planning permission or prior consultation with the authorities, and moreover in the Conservation Area.

A council planning officer visited the site in mid-November and required the developers to submit a retrospective planning application. Elmbridge asked them to halt works, but they did not do so. They sent in an invalid application

towards the end of the year, and Elmbridge asked for the requisite supplementary documentation that must accompany an application. This was not forthcoming by the end of January. They were served notice on 1 February that unless a valid application was in hand within seven days, legal enforcement would be started. The Chairs of both the Association and the Conservation Area Advisory Committee wrote to Ba Siam to express grave concern. After the deadline had passed, sufficient - though meagre documentation was received to permit the council to register a backdated application. In the statement that accompanies this application, the structure erected alongside the former Crown is described as a "decorative piece." See photo. The site is surrounded by five Grade II Listed buildings not counting the Home of Compassion and is within close line of sight of the Grade I Listed church.

Many residents have voiced objections to the developers' approach, indicating that they will not eat at the new restaurant until it complies strictly with the planning procedure and decision. It is for individual residents to reach their own decisions. There are good eating places in the village whose owners respect planning constraints and have worked with the community, earning the custom of residents. We hope that the operators of the new restaurant will decide to join that number.

Friends in need

In January, the Friends of Thames Ditton Hospital raised a further £4,300 with the pantomime Beowulf plus supper at the Vera Fletcher Hall, sponsored by Dairy Crest. Ruth Lyon and Karen Randolph (Chairman of the Friends) organised the event to raise further money towards echocardiogram equipment for the consultant cardiologist clinics held at Emberbrook. This follows over £60,000 they raised for new equipment for the ear, nose and throat clinics, an advanced electrocardiogram machine and ultrasound, so that NHS patients can be diagnosed quickly, often within two weeks, instead of waiting for up to 12 weeks for appointments at Kingston or St. George's hospitals. The equipment remains in the Friends' ownership so that it cannot be diverted elsewhere by the NHS.

Guide Hut update

The denizens of the Guide hut in Church Walk are getting excited as their fundraising target is now within reach. With the main heater having failed last winter, they have been grateful that the weather has been mostly mild. All project plans and permissions are now finalised. To complete the refurbishment of the hut

they needed to raise almost £100,000, in the end. So far they have just over £60,000 (thanks, everyone!), and are waiting to hear the outcome of a bid to the councils for a further £30,000. Some pledges depend on other pledges being met, so there is still a bit of juggling for everything to fall into place. There's a final £10,000 to find and they're pulling out all the stops to raise it in time to carry out the works in summer 2012. So, expect to be inundated with requests to 'buy a roof tile' and watch out for Rainbows, Brownies and Guides earning their fundraising badges around the village. You know you want to.

O Thames how do I love thee? Let me count the (three) ways...

The river was one of the main draws to live in Thames Ditton and yet, aside from a pint or two at one of our lovely riverside pubs or the odd walk to feed the ducks, it took me almost two years to find a way to get on the water. So in the hope of encouraging others to take the plunge here are three easy ways to start messing about on boats.

Simplest is to buy your own boat, and use one of the many public slipways to launch it. As it happens we have slipways ideally located next to our two riverside pubs, namely the Albany and the Swan. These are both relatively small but large

enough for launching a kayak/canoe or even a small powered craft.

Remember that if you are using your own boat on the River Thames, then it needs to be registered with the Environment Agency and this can be done for a small annual fee. The fee is a lot lower for an unpowered craft and I am hoping that's a good enough reason for you to stick to using muscle powered boats – I guarantee they are more rewarding.

If like I do, you live in a tiny cottage and storage or perhaps transport is an issue then you could invest in a decent inflatable. This was in fact how I first managed to get myself on to the water and from my first paddle I was hooked.

Lugging a boat around can become tiresome and an inflatable has its own disadvantages but luckily for us we have two fantastic boat clubs, sandwiching the Albany, that have slightly different options for the wannabe punter!

To the left of the Albany Pub, as you approach from Queen's Road, is the River Club (the former British Motor Yacht Club's dinghy section). The River Club is a members club in which members own their own boats and store them at the club. There is a very reasonable annual membership fee and boat storage costs. The club accepts sailing boats (some with small motors on them for days with no wind) and also has racks for canoes/kayaks. The clubhouse is yours as a member to use,

whether it is for a nice cup of tea before setting out on the river or storing a cold beer for your return. The club also has a row boat and the club launch available for hire and members can also use the club as a nice place to relax and make use of the basic yet very functional facilities. It's like having your very own private river frontage!

If you'd rather not have your own boat, perhaps prefer a slightly more social offering or if you are a relatively novice paddler then you have a lovely alternative: to the right of the Albany is the impressive Dittons Skiff and Punting club. As the name implies the club has its own fleet of skiffs and punts for members to use, included in the again very reasonable annual membership fee.

The skiffs themselves deserve a special mention as they are hand built using modern materials to a Viking design and to say they look beautiful is an understatement (just don't ask how much they cost the club to buy!). One look at the sleek river boats will have you itching to get out onto the river no matter how cold the weather! You don't have to be competitive – one skiff is named "Out To Lunch"!

Do not be daunted if you are a novice rower/punter as the club runs beginner days and also will guide you to using the correct technique. The club is very sociable and even has a bar (with very reasonably priced drinks!) and a balcony overlooking the river with an unparalleled view of Hampton Court Palace.

If you are interested in finding out more of any of the above or perhaps would like to know of some other options to get onto the river, from hiring powered boats to riding a ferry then have a look at the Thames Ditton Residents' Association forum online where I am trying to compile a list of all the ways to get onto the river.

Whatever option you do go for – I do hope to see you on the river soon. You'll find it's a lovely friendly place to be!

Villagers have long enjoyed playing on the water. Our bit of river was the venue for the inaugural event of the world's first Canoe Club, now the Royal Canoe Club, on Saturday 27 April 1867. In a "race over land and water" entrants had to get out of their canoes to round each of four markers on the banks, carrying their craft. Apart from a cup for the winner, and a canoe called "Cuisine" for the runner-up, another prize was, according to the Ingoldsby Legends: "a beautiful little kitchen, which cooks for two men and weighs 2lb. It now bears the following inscription: 'Designed by the Captain, presented by the Cook, won by the Purser.'" The current crop of ardent canoeists includes Andrew Roberts, the Association's Highways Convenor, who has twice completed the Devizes to Westminster canoe marathon.

Sisley painted a regatta at this spot in about 1874 and in 1887 this annual event was described as "an Aquatic Sports and Venetian Fête." The Dittons Skiff and Punting Club was formed in 1923 – see www.dittons.org.uk . There is also the Thames Ditton rowing regatta, organised in May every year since it was established by three keen amateur oarsmen in 1948. The next one is on 12 May.

For the irresponsible, the placid river has its risks. You can lose your butler, which is dashed inconvenient. The press reported in 1836 that, one Saturday night in late November "John Wood, a fine young man, butler to Sir Edward Sugden of Boyle Farm, was drowned by falling from a punt into which he went, after having been previously drinking at Kingston, for the purpose of procuring more liquor at Ditton." You have been warned.

The Battling Lamberts of Weston Green





the battle of Copenhagen


A few memorial tablets in St Nicholas' Church, a dried-up pond, a row of cottages, a scholarship fund dwindled to a pound or two, a recent plaque... all that remains here of the Lamberts. Yet this family was a major presence in the parish for a century. They served their country and our community well. Could I travel back in time, Christmas dinners at Weston

House would be high on my list. As the port was passed, the tales must have been wonderful.

These were practical fighting men, making history happen. One captained a ship of the line at the battle of Copenhagen; later he commanded the squadron that guarded the Emperor



His younger brother led the 10th Brigade in Napoleon's defeat at Waterloo; another brother battled the Americans as Captain of HMS Java, 38 guns, in a famous naval engagement which led to his death. Another also soldiered in the Napoleonic wars and ended as Lieutenant-Governor of Jamaica. The youngest brother played a role in the first (Maori) independence of New Zealand, and later started the second Burmese War.

Of their sons, likewise centred on Weston Green, one fought with the Grenadier Guards against the Russians at the Battle of the Alma. The Alma inn, now known as Marney's, probably took its name from that Lambert connection. Another commanded our naval squadron in Australia: he married a local Campbell girl who in 1886, widowed, was elected the first woman councillor for Thames Ditton. An early photographer, she accompanied her husband en poste in Australia, where her photographs are preserved in the National Gallery. Two of our Lamberts were keen cricketers, father and son, playing occasionally for MCC and England on home postings.

With several Johns and several Roberts, disentangling their history has not been easy. Online resources combined with parish records have helped greatly with disambiguation. Weston House, demolished a century ago to make way for the substantial suburban houses along Weston Green and Weston Avenue, was a hub for the family. But its members led peripatetic careers in the armed services, and when in England they also had various rented addresses, including at times The Elms, The Newlands, Ember

Cottage, and other substantial 'cottages' owned or let in Weston Green as well as addresses elsewhere in London and Southern England. To complicate matters, there are several lines of Lamberts in Britain, and at least two baronetcies starting with a Sir John Lambert!

Our Lamberts are not the descendants of Sir John Lambert, a General in Cromwell's New Model Army. Their origins are quite different. In the mid-1600s John or Jean Lambert was a French merchant at Saint Martin on the Île de Ré. just off La Rochelle. He married Marie Le Pevre, also of that island, and their son John was born in 1666, educated in England as a Protestant, and became a very wealthy merchant in London. Three centuries ago our Government was looking to the private sector to take on a crippling national debt (this may sound familiar!). The South Sea Company was formed to do that in return for trading concessions, and John Lambert was one of its founding directors, committing the then fabulous sum of over £400,000. He made а baronet recommendation of the Chancellor of the Exchequer, and lived at Clarges Street off Piccadilly (formerly Portugal Street) with his wife Madeleine née Bedzelin, the daughter of a Rouen merchant.

Born in 1732, Robert Alexander Lambert, the second son of Sir John Lambert's son John (the second baronet), had to make his own way. He joined the Royal Navy. Commissioned Lieutenant in 1754, Commander 1759 and Captain in 1760, he led a very active seagoing career, commanding the sloop Jamaica, then captaining in turn HMS Wager, 20 guns, Valeur, 28, Phoenix, 40, then ships of the

line Dorsetshire, 64, Niger and Leviathan, 64 based in the West Indies.

Fortunately Capt. Robert Lambert, and son Robert who was a midshipman aboard from the age of 8, escaped the foundering of the Leviathan on 27 February 1780, for they shipped home in the Carron and on 22 March, his wife wrote in her diary that "my Dear Capt. L and my darling Child were restored to me." Dear Capt. L went on to become a Commissioner in the Navy, sired his youngest son in 1795 at the age of 63, and died in the early 1800s.

On 19 January 1768 Captain Lambert, who lived near Old Alresford in Hampshire when he was not at sea, later in Mayfair, married Catherine Byndloss. She came with wealth from slave plantations in Jamaica. Her colonial ancestors were closely associated with Admiral Sir Henry Morgan (1635-1688), the famous bloodthirsty privateer, sometime prisoner in the Tower of London, suitor in one of the first ever cases of libel (for being called a pirate), and later rehabilitated.


Now, if ever a woman deserved a national Medal Of Motherhood (MOM?), it was Catherine Byndloss. Of her five warrior sons by Robert Lambert, three of whom came to live in Weston Green, one was to be killed in action, while two became Admirals and two became Generals. Her daughter Maria married another fighting officer, who became a Major in the 6th Dragoons (The Carabiniers).

It was Robert and Catherine's eldest son Robert Stuart Lambert, born in 1771, who put down anchor here. He had followed his father into the Navy at an early age, was made Lieutenant in 1791 while serving in the East Indies and then on the Barfleur, 98 guns, under Captain, later Lord Collingwood – Nelson's colleague. Rising rapidly, Robert Lambert was promoted Commander and given the sloop Swift. Soon Captain of the Saturn at the Battle of Copenhagen, where Nelson turned his blind eye to Parker's signal, he went on to become a Vice-Admiral.

In May 1798 while still a Captain, he bought Weston House for 3,738 guineas from Mary, Lady Twysden, daughter of the interesting rags-to-riches George Jarvis who may have had the house built.

In December the following year our Capt. Robert Stuart Lambert married Charlotte Pigou and installed her at Weston. She was the daughter of Frederick Pigou, another merchant of French Huguenot extraction, and her grandfather, also named Frederick, was a director of the East India Company, and connected with the tea trade to America. The firm of Pigou and Booth suffered at the Boston Tea Party. Frederick also coowned a gunpowder factory at Dartford. The Pigous had connections with Kingston upon Thames where, in All Saints Church, there is a plaque to Frederick Pigou the elder who died in 1792.

Alas I can find no photographs or drawings of Weston House, but while it remained in the possession of the Lambert family for many decades, they were of course subject to the exigencies of the service, and during postings they sometimes tried to let it (the couple did have at least one child, but it seems they didn't survive). For example, in 1812

when Capt. Robert Stuart Lambert was posted to HMS Duncan, the following advertisement appeared in the Morning Chronicle of 1 April, which seems to fit the case:

"Weston Green, in the Vicinity of Esher and Hampton Court, 12 1/2 miles from London, to be let for two Years completely furnished, a desirable villa, consisting of an entrance hall, dining, drawing and ante rooms, breakfast parlour and study, five principal bedrooms and two dressing rooms, and six rooms to the attic; good kitchen, cellaring and every other domestic accommodation, with pleasure grounds, a handsome greenhouse and ice house, large kitchen garden, walled and fully cropped; hot house and grapery; a compact farm and farm yard; double coach house and stabling for seven horses, with 35 acres of meadow land, in a ring fence..."

With Robert, the eldest, installed with his wife in Weston House, and on his way to becoming a Vice-Admiral, two of his younger brothers also took houses in Weston Green in between postings – the obituary of the fourth brother, who didn't live here, notes that all the brothers were very close. And now it's time to present the rest of the family.

Robert's first younger brother was John Lambert, later to become General Sir John Lambert GCB. He is believed to have rented The Elms before 1821, when in England; and later he rented The Newlands from 1841 before moving into Weston House which he owned in the years following Robert's death in 1836. The next brother, Captain Henry Lambert,

a highly operational officer, spent most of his time at sea and had been married just a year without issue when he was killed in action at the beginning of 1813. Next, Samuel Lambert, who became a Major-General, like brother John led an active life of soldiering. Along with Henry he is no trace in our local records, but we may be confident that Henry and Samuel will have visited their elder brother Robert at Weston House when on leave. The youngest brother George, also very operational, and later to be known nationally as 'the Combustible Commodore' en route to becoming Admiral Sir George Robert Lambert CGB, at various times rented Ember Cottage from the Taylors of Imber Court, owned a substantial cottage at the tip of Weston Green opposite the Newlands while living in another nearby, or occupied Weston House, eventually renting Norbiton Place before moving to Hastings for his last post as C-in-C The Nore.

The next generation showed continuing vigour. General Sir John's son, John Arthur Lambert, became a General too. He took over Weston House on the death of his father there in 1847. Admiral Sir George's son Rowley Lambert went on to become an Admiral in his turn. Towards the end of his life he rented a house from Hannibal Speer known as Grubbe's House, later called Kingwater, where now is the broad verge of Longmead and St. Helen's at Weston Green Road.

Having introduced these exciting Lamberts, I'll take a look at some of their exploits in the next few issues.



Councillors David Lowe and Edward Rowe



The Residents' Association and the wider Thames Ditton community have suffered a sad loss in the deaths of former councillors David Rowe and Edward Rowe in December. We have been exceptionally lucky in having two such able and committed councillors serve us for so long.

David Lowe was elected to Elmbridge Council for Thames Ditton ward in May 2002, within a year of his retirement from a senior position with the large computer company I.C.L., and served as councillor until 2010. He will be remembered as a diligent ward councillor - no one ever contacted him without their problem being looked into and a solution found. David brought to the Council his knowledge and experience as the Planning Officer of Thames Ditton & Weston Green Residents' Association. In that role he had looked at the many applications in Thames Ditton and Weston Green and supported residents in their representations against over-large or unneighbourly proposals or the threat of shops being converted to residential in the High Street, undermining the viability of remaining High Street shops. As Vice Chairman of the Council's East Area Planning Committee he played an important part in forming Elmbridge planning policies. His experience with ICL was put to good use in committees dealing with IT development where he saved the Council thousands of pounds through his advice on IT contracts.

Outside the Council David was a Governor of Esher College and a very effective Chairman of Governors of Thames Ditton Infants School. He delighted in the enthusiasm of the very young children and one of the parents said of him "David always seemed the perfect father figure". One of his legacies is the Vera Fletcher Hall where as Chairman of the Management Committee he led and oversaw many new facilities- as a result the Hall was described by Elmbridge council as a model community hall.

The Residents' Association was a natural home for David, as it was for Edward Rowe since they both firmly believed that local government should not be dominated by the national political parties. Outside the Council and the RA, David's priorities were always his family, Connie, Dennis, Robin, Melanie and of course the grandchildren – and we thank them all for sharing him with us.

Within a year of retiring from a senior position with Norwich Union **Edward Rowe** became Chairman of the Thames Ditton & Weston Green Residents Association 1996 – 1998. From 1998 to

2007 he acted as Advertising Manager of Thames Ditton Today during which the magazine increased in size as he attracted new advertisers and increasing income.

He was a councillor for Thames Ditton ward from 2000 to 2007 and from 2002 to 2006 he was a member of the Residents' Administration which ran Elmbridge Council. He had the most difficult job as the Cabinet member for resources bringing in the budget each year – during the period when Elmbridge was funding and building the new Excel Leisure Centre and the new Heart Shopping Centre in Walton.

For over ten years Edward was Chairman of the Vera Fletcher Hall

Association during which time it established itself as the theatre and concert hall in Thames Ditton, Edward attended every show from classic chamber concert to comedy revue. With his Irish charm and wonderful wit he was the best chairman of any organisation I have known. From tight finance committees to contentious public meetings Edward would get through the business remarkably quickly while allowing everyone their say, turning any awkward moment with a light word and leading everyone to a happy consensus without a vote. He leaves his wife Celia and their children Anthea and Russell and our sympathies go out to them.

It has received rave reviews and been

The story of the seamstress Mimi and her four friends living in a bohemian garret in Paris is full of some of Puccini's most beautiful arias.

Our childrens' shows always have music at their heart and Image Musical Theatre's **The Wonderful Wizard of Oz** on Saturday 24 March is a family participation musical with Dorothy, the Tin Man, Scarecrow and Cowardly Lion all following the Yellow Brick Road... On Saturday 5th May Noisy Oyster presents **The Three Billy Pigs,** the story of three little pigs who set off to build their dream houses only to find that things do not work out as they expect. Live music, puppets and story telling make this an enchanting story for 4-8year olds.



The House of Commons Defence Committee, drawing attention to the devastating effects of a putative hostile, space-based 'Goldeneye' weapon focusing an electromagnetic pulse on Britain, has called upon the Government to treat the matter "with the seriousness it deserves." Leaving aside this classic English ambiguity (why couldn't they just say "very seriously"?), there can be no doubt that taking out all electronic equipment would cause a frightful degradation of essential services that keep our fragile advanced society working, starting with the bar at the House of Commons

We managed to head off plans to sell Thames Ditton Hall, and close the Ember Centre, and that led to a thriving Intergenerational Centre in the village. We helped to start the avalanche that buried Surrey's pay-anddisplay aberration. We got longer-stay charges in the car park halved to realistic levels. We got some drains improved at long last.

We've beaten off, or watered down, much unacceptable development and encouraged more constructive stuff. We even got a phone mast erected at a more suitable site. And now we've got the Boundary Commission to see reason where Surrey County Council would not. We've helped build pressure to get better street-lights for our heritage areas – Elmbridge is, I think, the only borough in the county that has done this.

These little victories bring some comfort and hope against the looming slow cataclysm of cuts, recession, impoverishment, and degradation of facilities. They're achieved by not rolling over; by hard work, making a good case and mobilising active support from you. I raise my glass to you, O residents – the Defence Committee for Thames Ditton and Weston Green. Thanks. Seriously.
