Thames Ditton Centre for the Community



Thames Ditton Centre for the Community

There has been a lot of concern and rumours that the Thames Ditton Centre for the Community is under threat of closure. We followed up with our local RA Councillors and they have confirmed that there are **no** plans to close the centre.

We understand that, following the devastating effect of the Covid pandemic on the vulnerable and the national crisis in our care system, EBC commissioned a review of community support services to get a better understanding of the overall picture in order to re-imagine the service to do a better job of meeting the needs of the community.

That study showed that care services are only reaching 2% of the Elmbridge population, whereas about 10% are considered 'in need'. It also showed a lack of demand for council services at the centre and suggested an alternative scenario -'handing it to the community' - so that the centre becomes 'a thriving, communityled hub', not council-run, allowing EBC to refocus its Community Care budget on the services that provide more targeted outcomes to people in need.

It was suggested this could be a model where a board of local trustees takes over responsibility for the centre with paid staff managing day-to-day operations such as bookings and running the café. The RA is among a wide group of stakeholders invited to participate in a community consultation which started in April to see if there are more effective ways of managing the centre. We regard the community centre as a vital asset and one that should be kept. We agree it is under-utilised and there is much more that could be done with it. We will continue to participate fully in the process to see how this can be addressed.

Environment Agency Drop-In



The Environment Agency 'Drop-In'

Representatives of the Environment Agency (EA) flooding department recently set up shop in the Albany pub car park to discuss with residents how to prepare for a flood and other flood-related issues. Tony Thompson, the convenor of the Residents' Association Flood Group, was there and set up a stand with a display of flooding information specifically relevant to Thames Ditton.

There were two bits of news from the EA. First, they are still thinking about a potential temporary flood barrier, having been delayed because of the need to consider how to ensure that it did not move during a flood. Second, following the survey of riverbank heights arranged by the Residents' Association (with funding from EBC) the EA has allocated some funds for an initial feasibility study for a permanent barrier.

Planning

The appeal against the decision to refuse a planning application for an **Aldi store** on the old Guy Salmon site will be determined by a public inquiry scheduled to start on June 20.

The RA feels strongly that this is not the right site for a supermarket for many reasons, not least the threat it would present to the viability of our local High Street shops. For more details on this, see our website article at: *www.residents-association.com*

We are therefore backing a 'Rule 6' involvement at the Public Inquiry. This allows us to make representations, employing a specialist planning barrister and expert witnesses. There is a considerable cost for this, and we estimate we need to raise $\pounds 20,000$ to cover our legal fees and other expenses.

We appreciate that everyone is facing considerably increased costs at present, but if anyone can help we would be very grateful. We have opened a crowd funding account with Collection Pot: *www.collectionpot.com/pot/3101900* The appeal will close when our target is reached, or on August 31, or when the inquiry result is announced. Should there be any surplus we will put it towards local community enhancement projects.

New Council for 2023/24

The disappointing news from the May elections is that the Residents' Group is no longer the largest group in Elmbridge Borough Council. Three RA losses to the Lib Dems plus three Conservative losses mean that the Lib Dems now have 19 seats on Council compared with the Residents' Group with 17 and the Conservatives with 12. The new Leader of the Council is Bruce McDonald (Claygate) of the Lib Dems.

The good news is that, with no overall majority, the Lib Dems will continue to work in coalition with the Residents' Group, much as we worked together before the election. The eight revamped Cabinet portfolios have been split evenly, with four positions each. The TD&WGRA is well represented with two councillors in the Cabinet. Alex Batchelor has been appointed as Portfolio Holder for Housing and Gill Coates retains her position as Portfolio Holder for Community Care. She is also the Deputy Leader of the Residents' Group.

The outgoing Mayor, Cllr Simon Waugh (Esher RA), recently announced that he had raised £60,000 for his chosen Mayor's charity, the Brain Tumour Charity.

Council priorities for 2023/24, by portfolio

Vision and transformation: Delivering the coalition's Vision 2030 for Elmbridge, transforming services and making Elmbridge a thriving, sustainable place to live, driven by the power of our community.

Finance and Resources: EBC only gets to retain 11% of the Council Tax collected. The Council's budget for 2023/24 is just £24 million and the priority is to deliver services within budget.

Climate change and sustainability: We have a Net Zero target for 2030 and measures being introduced include a green fleet strategy; solar panels, LED lighting, green procurement strategies etc. Community priorities are air quality and sustainable living.

Community care: This absorbs almost 20% of EBC's budget but we are only reaching 2% of the local population. 9-10% of Elmbridge's population are vulnerable and in need, so the

priority is targeting this budget to reach more people who need support.

Environmental Services: Keeping our streets and open spaces clean; collecting our domestic waste on time; renegotiating our Joint Waste Solutions Contract.

Leisure / Culture and Property Investment: Managing the 57% of Elmbridge that is covered in green space - commons, woodlands, parks and recreation grounds and cemeteries. Overseeing strategic improvement projects for Hurst Pool, Esher town centre and Lower Green.

Housing: Tackling the housing waiting list; supporting 200 Afghan families still living in hotels; supporting Ukrainian refugees to settle; intervening with social landlords to improve the lives of tenants.

Planning, Business and Enterprise: Seeing the Local Plan through the Inspection stages; balancing protection of our Green Belt and conserving Elmbridge's character with building the affordable homes and infrastructure that Elmbridge needs; helping Elmbridge town centres to thrive; supporting local businesses.

Update from Nick Darby, our Surrey County Councillor



In this report I cover more detail than usual on potholes. This is a major issue with significant disintegration of some roads, reflecting under investment in years gone by.

Those I have reported recently include:

Embercourt Rd - (third set of repairs outstanding)

St Leonards Road

Weston Green Road - towards Esher Station, which tends to flood, masking deep holes

Lime Tree Avenue

Portsmouth Road Esher, from Scilly Isles.

Church Road Long Ditton

Ewell Road Long Ditton - a series of holes reflecting the overall state of this road

Walton Road East Molesey - this has all but disintegrated and needs resurfacing

Woodstock Lane North - the road to Squires.

This is a cross section of local roads in the Dittons where the potholes were large, deep, and dangerous. In each case I requested priority attention, in one case getting the road closed and repair under way within 45 mins.

All of this is frustrating, a combination of numbers, the number of teams employed by the SCC contactor, the speed of action, funding and the quality of work. My hope is that SCC will innovate by investing in new machinery (both more efficient and quicker) and covering a wider area than just an individual small hole. SCC are about to undertake a thorough review of the new contractor's first year, much to be desired.

I am happy to report these for residents if you email me. However, reporting issues to SCC online via their website is easy, and is what I would recommend.

My second item is the application for registration of a section of Long Ditton as a Village Green. This includes the area known as One Tree Hill, and the Stokes Field Nature Reserve. I recommend all of this for anyone who does not already know it. Many in the Dittons worked to put the application together, a good number giving evidence to the Inspector. The Public Inquiry recently took place in Long Ditton Village Hall. The Inspector will produce a report with recommendations, which will be considered by the Surrey County Council Planning & Regulatory Committee - so no quick decision.

One hundred years of messing about in boats





Dittons Skiff and Punting Club members invite you to join them in this their centenary year

Tucked away at the riverside end of Queens Road, alongside The Albany pub, is Dittons Skiff and Punting Club. This historic sporting and social institution may be unfamiliar to many Thames Ditton residents but with 100 years of history, record-breaking feats, Olympiad rowers and a thriving sporting and social calendar, it's a hidden gem.


The club enables people of all ages to enjoy the traditional Thames sports of skiffing and punting on the glorious stretch of the river between Hampton Court Palace and Kingston Bridge. A skiff is a traditional wooden Thames rowing boat with fixed seats, and skiffing is sculling (rowing) with two oars. Racing punts are narrower than those seen in Cambridge, but in the same way the craft is moved by pushing off the riverbed using a punt pole.

Back in 1923 former residents of Thames Ditton were keen founders of the club, and the river was a focus for community events and sporting prowess. Men and women competed in regattas (races), finessing their rowing and punting techniques for agility and speed. Historic postcards show that on regatta days the rivers were teaming with beautiful wooden craft and the banks were thronged with cheering people wearing boaters and blazers.

Since the Roaring Twenties the challenges of war, social change and financial limitations have all meant that local councils and sports people have worked with huge energy and determination to keep skiffs and punts on this part of the Thames.

When the club was looking for new premises in the late 1980s, it seized the opportunity promoted in Thames Ditton Today in 1987 which outlined a competition organized by the Thames Ditton and Weston Green Residents' Association calling for ideas for the then under-developed Albany riverside site. Dittons Skiff and Punting Club put in an entry – and won! Years of fundraising and negotiations with the site owner Elmbridge Council followed, and in 1995 the Mayor of Elmbridge formally opened our purpose-built boathouse with a club room, bar and gym, plus its river terrace with stunning views over the Thames, Home Park and Hampton Court Palace.

Throughout the week club members take punts and skiffs on to the Thames for a leisurely outing or for race practice ahead of regattas. As with all sports there are techniques and skills to learn, plus the need to understand the flow and speed of the river itself. Both disciplines build strength and stamina as well as a strong core and legs; balance and co-ordination are important too. This all comes with practice time on the water and the guidance of experienced coaches, of which the club has many.

In this centenary year Dittons Skiff and Punting Club is celebrating in style, with lots of events planned on and off the river. The first was the Boxing Day Regatta, a onemile sprint from the club up to Hampton Court Bridge and back, a tradition since 1924, though today there are a lot more Santa hats! The Centenary Flotilla takes place in June, and the Centenary Ball in the autumn will have a 1920s theme, but with a 2020s playlist for the dancing.

The club currently has more than 150 members, men and women from a range of ages and backgrounds who run the club themselves and together share the joy of spending time on the Thames. Some focus on these sports as a way to maintain fitness and train for competitive races; for others, the key benefit is enjoying a shared activity

on the water with like-minded people. The important thing is that everyone enjoys themselves at whatever level they choose.

The Vice Captain for Skiffing, Guy Hanscomb, himself a Thames Ditton resident, explains: "Skiffing and punting are great sports for fitness and wellbeing, and we're also proud to be one of a handful of Thames clubs playing our part in keeping these traditional sports alive. It's great to join with fellow members to skiff and punt on this beautiful stretch of the Thames on a summer's evening, and then return to the clubhouse to socialise over drinks on the river terrace!"

Dittons Skiff and Punting Club offers members great value for money. The 2023 membership price for an adult is £235 a year, giving unlimited access to the activities, clubhouse amenities, regattas and all social events on the calendar. Members also have opportunities to take part in major events including the spectacular Great River Race, an amazing chance to skiff through the heart of London, past some of its most famous landmarks.

In its centenary year the club is keen to encourage more people to discover the joys of skiffing and punting. "If getting out onto the Thames this summer appeals to you, come along to one of our free Taster Sessions," invites Guy.

"These run every Thursday evening at 6.30pm from 25 May to 24 August. Adults of any age are welcome and you don't need to have any previous experience. Our experienced members will be ready to greet you and accompany you out onto the river, and afterwards we'll invite you to join us for a drink on the terrace. A summer on the river awaits!"

New Village Green at Long Ditton

We are delighted that Elmbridge Borough Council (EBC) has voluntarily registered Stokes Field, Long Ditton, as a village green. This follows a long campaign by the Save Hinchley Wood Long Ditton Green Belt group and the Open Spaces Society. Comprising about eight hectares of mixed woodland, open grassland and scrub intersected by numerous paths, the land is also a Local Nature Reserve.

The Thames Ditton & Weston Green Residents' Association gave a substantial donation to the campaign to register both Stokes Field and One Tree Hill as a village green, believing that village green status affords greater protection than Green Belt and will preserve this green space for generations to come. The funding was towards the costs of the Public Inquiry including a specialist barrister and an expert witness when Taylor Wimpey opposed their application.

In 2018, after Elmbridge Council's Local Plan consultants had identified the adjoining

One Tree Hill, owned by developers Taylor Wimpey, as *'lesser-performing Green Belt'*, concerned local residents applied to register both Stokes Field and One Tree Hill as village greens. Local residents had used the land for recreation for several decades and therefore they believed it qualified for registration.


EBC opposed the Stokes Field application to be registered as a village green and Open Spaces Society local correspondent Rodney Whittaker joined the campaign, supported by local councillors, to persuade the Council voluntarily to register the land as village green. This registration has now been agreed by the Council, which withdrew its opposition in the face of local pressure.

Rodney Whittaker on behalf of the Open Spaces Society, (of which the Residents' Association is a member) said "We are delighted that Elmbridge Council was prepared to listen to our arguments for voluntary registration of this popular piece of land. Now it will be safe and local people have rights of recreation here. In doing this, the Council has set an excellent example to others".

"No less than 57% of Elmbridge's land area comprises registered commons and other open, accessible spaces. The Residents' Association led Council has a deserved reputation for excellent care of its commons. The areas are all well used, and much valued by the borough's residents. "Now we hope to succeed at the public Inquiry on One Tree Hill and to add it to the village green register as well."

Thank you retired RA Borough Councillor Karen Randolph



This local election saw Karen Randolph stand down after serving for 16 years as our Residents' Association Councillor at Elmbridge Borough Council (EBC). In those years she has helped countless residents navigate local government processes, deal with local issues and access services

She has lived in Thames Ditton for nearly 40 years. In 1995 the planning proposal for a Tesco superstore, garage and mega car park opposite Giggs Hill Green galvanised her to get involved in the Residents' Association and fight on behalf of the local community. Looking back she said "Alarmed by the potential impact I got involved with the Residents' Association (RA) campaign which saw those plans shelved and led to the existing more sympathetic development of housing and green space. I realised then that people must get involved if we want a say in how our communities are shaped."

She is now involved with the campaign to prevent another supermarket and car park being inappropriately developed on the opposite corner of Giggs Hill Green.

Having served on the Executive Committee of the Residents' Association, including a spell as Chair, she was elected to Elmbridge Borough Council (EBC) in 2007.

Karen ran her own market research consultancy and is a trained mediator, skills which have served her in good stead in her years as a Councillor.

In her time at EBC she has focused on planning and says: "Planning is complex. Over the years I have learned a lot about the processes and policies that must be considered when applications are made.

She spent many years on the East Area Planning Sub-Committee and the full Planning Committee, as well as taking part in the Local Plan Working Group. Having been the Shadow Planning Portfolio Holder she was the ideal choice as Planning Portfolio Holder in the Residents Group / Lib Dem coalition at EBC, a role she held for six years in total.

Her wealth of experience helped navigate the tricky waters of the Local Plan, to develop a planning and development structure that protects the Green Belt and challenges central government directives on the number of housing units EBC was expected to build. (The Local Plan has yet to pass through its final stage, which is a review by a Planning Inspector.)

Local resident Edwin Glasgow said "Our village is so lucky to have someone who is not only highly intelligent and articulate but also hugely kind, deeply caring and selflessly public-spirited." Reflecting on her time at EBC Karen said: "I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as a councillor and have really enjoyed meeting so many people across and beyond our community. Planning is a fascinating subject and I am a great believer in what good planning should achieve and how local residents can benefit – development does not have to be negative, it just has to be appropriate and well designed. It has been a privilege to be the portfolio holder."

In addition, whilst at the council she was involved in handling social housing issues, neighbour disputes and helping residents navigate the complexity of local government. She is Chair of the Thames Ditton Almhouses, helping to maintain this valuable community asset.

Over the years Karen has been an active campaigner in trying to maintain the local community hospitals across Elmbridge, particularly in Thames Ditton and Molesey. She was Chair of the Friends of Thames Ditton Community Hospital during which time the Friends raised enough money to provide ultrasound and echocardiograph capacity which benefitted many patients at Emberbrook. She currently sits on the Patients Participation Group (PPG) for Thorkhill Surgery and would like to encourage many more patients to get involved with the PPGs.

Now she is looking forward to having time to help with her wonderful new granddaughter, spending time with far--flung family and friends and doing the things she didn't have time to do while in the cabinet at the council. We are delighted that we continue to have access to her wealth of experience as she will continue on the RA Executive in her role as convener for Health and Community.

Battling the mighty mite



The Spring edition of '*Meet your Distributor*' introduced Nell Nockles, who told us about her passion for educating people about the impact and danger of dust mites. It was news to us, so we asked her to tell us a little bit more.

Having suffered severely with asthma when I was young I was amazed to find out that common house dust mites were a cause of asthma. I changed to sleeping on an air mattress to remove the mites from my bed and my health radically improved.

I was so excited by the dramatic change in my health that, with the support of doctors, I have dedicated myself to informing people about mites, and the dangers from house dust mites, a major cause of allergic disease worldwide.

In the 17th century the cloth merchant Antonie van Leeuwenhoek (1632-1723) made a microscope to look at barely visible life forms. One group he noted he named *'little wolves'*, an appropriated name for a dust mite. This was probably the first human sighting of an animal that has been on earth for millions of years. Scientists know this by looking at fully formed mites encased in amber about 145 million years ago.

Today the number of described dust mite species is estimated to be about 45,000. Many are significant causes of damage or harm to agriculture and animal health. For example, storage mites that can spoil grain stores by introducing fungi from their droppings, ticks that bite and carry disease in their saliva, and dust mites that can cause allergies in people and animals sensitive or allergic to their presence.

Of all mites studied it is the common house dust mite belonging to the species *Dermatophagoides* that ranks highest in medical research, because it is a major cause of allergic dermatitis (eczema), rhinitis (hay fever) and asthma. It is not the mite itself that is a focus of medical research but a digestive enzyme in its droppings that has been described as *'like papain, a meat tenderizer used in the food industry'*.

Immune reactions to this aggressive enzyme can result in an irritation, allergic reaction or both. Veterinary research has noted that the mite's enzyme is a near perfect match to the mange mite's enzyme that causes itchy sores in sheep - a comparison that would not surprise scientists who believe that millions of years ago the house dust mite was a mange mite that made a lifestyle shift to scavenger.

As a scavenger the mite eats bacteria, fungi, yeasts, wheat, toenails, pollen and any organic matter but its favourite food is old, discarded skin scales. An adult house





In addition to the financial support needed, volunteers were encouraged to make themselves known when it comes to the work required at the end of November each year. Thanks were given to former RA Cllr Tricia Bland and the TD Foundation especially for the funding of the defibrillator at Budgens.

Planning issues continue to keep our RA Cllrs and Officers busy with the ALDI application, which was refused by EBC, the subject of a public hearing due to commence on June 20. Mention was also made of the Molesey Ventures site in Orchard Lane (off Ember Lane), where we are supporting local residents' objections to an inappropriate development.
