Christmas Lights in Thames Ditton High Street

The Residents Association will be organising and installing the Lime Tree Christmas lights and the Christmas trees above shops and businesses along Thames Ditton High Street. The RA has also been successful in its bid to be included in the Elmbridge Borough Council Christmas Lights on lampposts contract to run from 2025 to 2029 inclusive. However, this cannot start until 2026 because the lampposts don't have commando sockets, and these are needed for the lights. Unfortunately, the contractors are unable to carry out this work in time for the festive period 2025 but have confirmed the necessary adaptations will be made, at EBC expense, to enable the lights in the High Street to be fully operational for Christmas 2026. This year's Christmas Fair takes place on Sunday 30 November. See insert in the middle pages for full details.

Vital Village Community Garden wins prestigious RHS award

Vital Village has won a Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) Britain in Bloom award in the 2025 'It's Your Neighbourhood' category for the South and South-east of England. It was awarded a level 4 (Thriving) for its beautiful community garden where produce and flowers are grown next to the Community Shop. The garden is the brainchild of Beth Rochford who said: "I am delighted to receive this award on behalf of everyone who has been involved

Any Questions broadcast from Weston Green

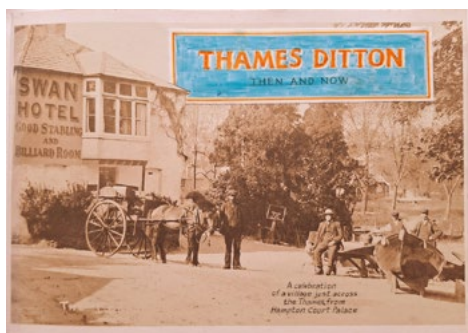

Planning Update

The application for an Aldi supermarket on Portsmouth Road, Thames Ditton, is not likely to be heard by the Planning Committee until the New Year. The Environment Agency has objected to the application as the development will take place on a culverted section of the river Rythe. The RA has also objected. The application reference is 2025/1182.

Development at Bransby Lodge, St Leonards Road, Thames Ditton:

A new application has been made to develop Bransby Lodge under reference 2025/2218. The plans are to demolish the existing house and build a terrace of 3, two-storey houses with rooms in the roof at the front of the site, together with an access road to rear, with parking, and a two-storey building containing a pair of semi-detached houses towards the rear. The RA will be looking at the proposal carefully to see if the previous reasons for refusal upheld at appeal have been overcome.

Housing development at Hill Park

Roses, Long Ditton: Although this proposed development is not in Thames Ditton or Weston Green, it is a large development of some 150 homes, which would inevitably have an impact on our local area. The reference number of the application is 2025/2018. Surrey Highways have expressed concerns about the development (see Nick Darby's comments on page 15) and the RA has also objected on highways grounds.

Connected Communities

The Council received eleven expressions of interest from community groups and charities who were interested in taking on the six council community centres. By the closing date there was at least one expression of interest for every centre. The centres are currently primarily day centres for the elderly, serving just 1 per cent of our community, and the aim of Connected Communities is to hand the buildings to community groups or charities so that they have control over their future and can help shape a wider range of activities for the whole community, not just

the small number of current users. Interested parties had until 14 November to put in their formal proposals. These are now being assessed against a framework of criteria agreed with a Residents Panel. Successful ‘bidders’ will be able to lease the centres for a peppercorn rent and will receive a grant of £131,000 to get up and running. The transfer to the new operators is likely to happen at the beginning of April 2026. The six centres are in Hersham, Molesey, Weybridge, Walton, Cobham and Claygate. The council’s other centre, Thames Ditton, was transferred to Vital Village CIC in a similar exercise in 2024.

All change for Surrey Councils Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) - an update:

The Government announced at the end of October that Surrey County Council and the 11 Surrey Districts and Borough Councils will be replaced by two unitary authorities in April 2027, to be called East Surrey and West Surrey. Elmbridge will be in East Surrey. To facilitate this change, there will be elections for councillors for East Surrey on Thursday

7 May 2026. From May 2026 until March 2027, East Surrey will run alongside the existing councils, and will be putting the staff, buildings, and structures in place to start delivering all council services from April 2027. Residents in Thames Ditton will be voting for two councillors, for the Thames Ditton and East Molesey Division, and residents in Weston Green will be voting for two councillors in the Long Ditton, Hinchley Wood and Long Ditton division. The government also announced that £500m of Woking Borough Council’s debt will be repaid by central government because ‘even after rationalisation of Woking’s historic assets, there is significant unsupported debt held by the Council that cannot be managed locally’.

Shrub removal at Queens Road

Gardens: Shrubs have been removed from the Queens Road gardens due to subsidence issues to neighbouring properties. Councillors are working with the Green Spaces team to turf the area and tidy up this small park. The graffiti on the sign is being removed at the time of going to press.

Update from Nick Darby, our Surrey County Councillor



I am pleased to report on a continuation of road safety improvements for pedestrians and drivers in Thames Ditton and Weston Green being made by Surrey Highways. White lines have been repainted, as well as on humps, on Embercourt Road and after a very long time, on the mini roundabout at the end of Speer Road where it meets Summer Road. There is also a new No Entry sign, to stop drivers taking a 'short cut' before the railway bridge and turning right off Station Road and into Speer Road. New 20 mph speed roundels on Station Road, are also due to be installed.

As highlighted in the Autumn edition of TD Today, I can confirm that after an eight year wait, Surrey Highways will be resurfacing the entire length of St Leonards Road - from the fountain roundabout to the Portsmouth Road - in the current financial year. Looking ahead to the financial year starting next April, I have included in my budget allowance, for work to go ahead on resurfacing Church Walk as well as for the footpaths on Lower Green Road, between Ember Lane and the railway bridge.

Planning

Residents will be aware of the threat posed by housing developments in Elmbridge. For example, while One Tree Hill in Long Ditton has been designated as 'Village Green' to protect the land from future development, this does not include the other side of the hill where Taylor Woodrow recently made an application to develop the Hill Park Roses Nursery area with a possible 150 houses.

I have noted comments made by Surrey's

County Highways Authority (CHA) in relation to the application, which considers the proposal unsustainable. Its strong objections include poor local unsafe roads, unsafe access to the development, no local public transport and a lack of suitable access for residents to make journeys on foot or cycle. In addition more than 600 objections have been made with Elmbridge Planning Department, while the Residents' Association and I have objected too.

Local Government Reorganisation

As mentioned in the RA Councillors' report on the previous pages, the Government has now come to a decision on the future of Local Government in Surrey. As readers will know, after eight years and due to my failing eyesight, it has been my intention to stand down from serving the local community. But I do hope to hear from anyone who would consider standing and representing the Residents' Association on the new unitary authority when the elections are held next May.

Could you be the Residents' Association Councillor in the new East Surrey Authority?

As written about in previous editions of this magazine, the Government announced in February 2025 that the county of Surrey will be in the fast-track lane to be reorganised at local government level. Elmbridge, Mole Valley, Surrey County Council along with other stakeholders proposed a 2 unitary system as the most sensible option. On 28th October the Government announced that they had decided that, whilst there were some merits to 3 unitary authorities for Surrey, 2 authorities would be the most financially viable and more likely to deliver the targets they have set for the county. Subject to a vote in parliament later this year, a new East Surrey Council will be operational from May 2027.

What does this mean for Thames Ditton, Weston Green and East Molesey?

Elmbridge Borough Council and Surrey County Council will cease to exist from May 2027. Clearly it is not sensible to have a

cliff edge closure of the current structure, so it has been decided that a shadow authority will be created to run alongside the current authorities from May 2026. Elections will be held for this shadow authority for East Surrey (Elmbridge, Mole Valley, Epsom and Ewell, Reigate and Banstead, Tandridge) which is where you may come in.

How can I become involved?

The Thames Ditton & Weston Green Residents' Association is looking for people who may be interested in standing for the new East Surrey Council for the new electoral divisions of East Molesey and Thames Ditton, or Long Ditton, Hinchley Wood and Weston Green. A Residents' Association councillor is independent of national party politics. Being a councillor certainly has its challenges however it is also fascinating and rewarding. You have the power to influence decisions that directly affect your community and can see the results of your labours in your own area. Councillors often talk about the immense satisfaction they have giving something back to their community. It requires all your problem solving and negotiation skills – plus some patience and humour. It can be personally fulfilling knowing residents have put their faith in you to serve the community. Two local authors publish their first books



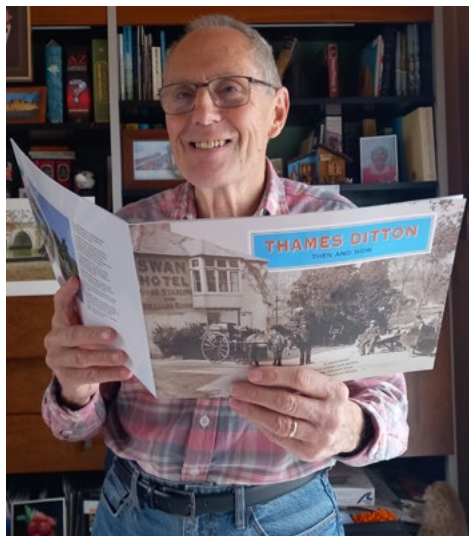
Julie Royce talks to Edmund Woolley and overleaf, to Gill Coates, about their contrasting stories

Thames Ditton Then and Now

Originally from Chorlton-cum-Hardy near Manchester, Edmund Woolley came to Thames Ditton in 1983 after moving south for a London based graphic design career and meeting the love of his life Dorley.

Since his retirement, Edmund has enjoyed developing his illustrative skills and knowledge of local history. He takes photos and uses acrylic paints to recreate local scenes in his home studio. It was while painting Picton House and learning about its history that he mused on the possibility of producing a local history book of his beloved Thames Ditton. He knew that Twickenham, Long Ditton and even his home town of Chorlton-cum-Hardy, all had their photo books illustrating scenes from the past, so why not Thames Ditton?

After a three year journey, researching, illustrating and even knocking on people's doors to ask questions about local features, Edmund has now published his A4 book in full colour with 24 pages and a glossy cover. It features 3 of his paintings, old black and

white photos alongside new colour ones, maps from 1897 and 1912, and a mixed narrative of personal musings about a photographic scene, quirky titbits of information and factual history highlights. It's an easy read and a good introduction to our local history – especially for anyone new to the area.

Edmund said: "The book is not intended to be a comprehensive history of Thames Ditton. It's my own personal story in words, photos and paintings, of life in the village from the past to the present day, I hope people enjoy it."

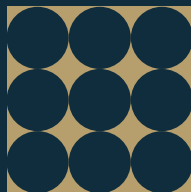
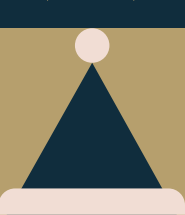

All Saints Church gets its colour back



Louise Russell reports on the latest news from Weston Green



Its bright and white again! Work to repair and repaint the beautiful Grade 2 listed All Saints Church in Weston Green was completed ahead of schedule this autumn following a highly successful £100,000 fund raising campaign.

It can again be called the ‘White Church’ by the pond thanks to generous support from the National Lottery Community Fund, the Elmbridge Council Community Spending Board and of course countless generous donations from the local community and beyond.

The response to the appeal has been tremendous and boosted by the hundreds

of people who have come and supported a year long series of fund raising events at the church and in Weston Green which have included concerts, theatre, quizzes, our flower festival and sponsored walks.

But although the £100k target has been reached, we realise we need to keep raising funds to ensure this iconic building is maintained for future generations. We will therefore continue to have mostly free of charge fundraising events in 2026, although donations are of course welcome. Some events are shown on page 33 but in addition, do visit the All Saints website for further news.

Weston Green Community Archive Milestone

In 2015 the National Lottery Heritage Fund awarded a grant of £10,000 towards a project to develop an archive collection of Weston Green. Now, after ten years of careful sorting, cataloguing and digitising by Pam Tiller, archivist at All Saints and her volunteer colleague Simon Crome, the project has reached a significant milestone.

The finalised Archives Catalogue Spreadsheet has now been submitted to Surrey History Centre along with several boxes of photographs, papers and plans for safekeeping. A total of 3513 items! In due course, this catalogue information will be added to Surrey History Centre's searchable database and the physical records will be available for interested researchers in their search room.

There are still many, many records and albums available to view in the archive room at All Saints. An archive morning was held in May as part of the events programme for Paint All Saints. It proved so popular that it

Nature and Climate Festival 2025 round-up

The fourth Thames Ditton and Weston Green Nature & Climate Festival, sponsored by HJC and Killik & Co, took place in October and attracted visitors from not just Thames Ditton but as far away as Kingswood and Epsom. Biodiversity and wildlife highlights this year included talks on **Plants for Health and Well-being** by local garden designer Gill Hall and **The Natural History of Elmbridge and its Commons** by Dave Page, former countryside officer with EBC.

Gill's beautifully illustrated talk, described by one visitor as "particularly excellent", was accompanied with a display of plants from Squires of Long Ditton and a walk round the community garden in Vital Village. Dave romped through 150 captivating slides of Elmbridge wildlife from insects to roe deer, majestic oaks

to the tiny Petty Whin, which is found in only one site in Elmbridge. He explained the importance of restoring and preserving grassland and heath habitats which have been increasingly crowded out by volunteer woodland and urban development over the last 100 years. We all left with a new appreciation of the fantastic biodiversity on our doorstep.

The **'Circular Economy'** theme focused on repurposing, re-using and recycling. Walton Repair Café joined us on Sunday to triage broken items and we partnered with Relove Technology to collect redundant

tech for repurposing in aid of our chosen charities, the Mayor of Elmbridge's charity and the David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation. We also introduced a semi-permanent Recycling Station at Vital Village (see following story)

The RA's Flood Group provided drop-in advice as part of the **'Rivers and Oceans'** theme, while the Thames Ditton Skiff & Punting Club organised a river clean-up the following week.

The **'Living Sustainably'** theme was catered for by the launch of our new handbook 'Live Life Better' (see feature on page 21).

There's nothing more sustainable than foraging for food and a few lucky people joined expert Julie Hiscox for a fascinating **Foraging Walk** to learn the secrets of the free food right under noses.

There was plenty for children too, with a litter pick and craft activity led by the Tap Dancing Pigeon of Covent Garden, a Create a Creature workshop with the David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation and a **'Binterrogation'** quiz. And for pure entertainment we enjoyed 'Music for the Environment' with Graham Cooke on his saxophone and the amazing 'We Are The Voice' children's environmental choir.

New Recycling Station for hard to recycle items

We currently only recycle just over half of our waste in Surrey. Frustratingly there are lots of things that can be recycled, but the current recycling service in Elmbridge does not cater for them.

As a result, Thames Ditton now has its own **Recycling Station**, which has recently

opened at Vital Village. Aimed at helping to solve the problem of handling waste that Elmbridge cannot, this new drop-in service will take a selection of hard-to-recycle items which will then be collected and processed by specialists.

The idea for the service came to RA Councillor Gill Coates. She says: "A brilliant company called Terracycle can recycle all sorts of things the Council does not accept. When I was researching for **Live Life Better**, I realised how many things were unnecessarily going to landfill locally and I thought - we should do something!"

The result is you can now bring six common items to Vital Village to recycle. They are: Pet food pouches, Coffee pods (any make), Dental care waste (toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, floss sticks), Eye care waste (disposable lenses, contact lens packaging, lens solution bottles), Medicine blister packs (empty) and Pringles tubes.

Each Terracycle box costs around £160-180, so it is not cheap. Gill adds: "I was lucky to get a grant from the Elmbridge Climate Change Action Fund to purchase two lots of five boxes. After that we will have to look to other options, such as crowdfunding or local business sponsorship, if we want to keep it going."

New Role at St Nicholas Church

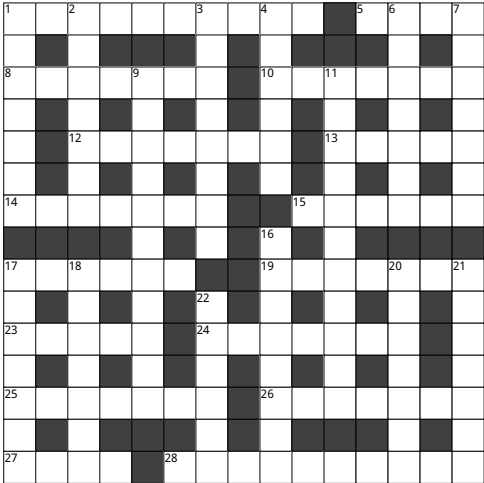
